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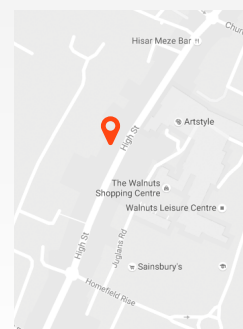

Car: Close to the motorway for junction four of the M25, A2, and M20.



Bus: Services many bus routes with destinations including Bromley, Chislehurst, Lewisham, Woolwich, Crystal Palace and Biggin Hill to name just a few.



Trains: Direct services from Orpington mainline station to London Bridge, Charing Cross, Cannon Street, London St Pancras, Blackfriars and Victoria. In the opposite direction you can reach Sevenoaks, Tunbridge Wells, Hastings and Ashford International.
